AASAS Response to Provincial Election Funding Commitments to Sexual Violence Support Services

The fact that sexual violence is being discussed by both parties during this election campaign is a sign that this issue's importance is being recognized and is being considered seriously.

AASAS is grateful to all the members of the public who raised this issue with the government and election candidates this year, expressing their support for adequately and sustainably funding sexual assault services in our province.
